What I need if I stay at home during an emergency

- Battery powered radio and torch, spare batteries for essential equipment



- First aid kit and medication



- Important information such as your emergency plan and important contact details



- Water and food for up to 3 days



- Blankets or other way to keep warm if the power goes off

- Anything else that I might need every day



Your notes...

Note: During a major bushfire or flood, others may not be able to help you. You should leave early if your home might become unsafe during an emergency.

What to take when I leave home in an emergency



- Food and water
- Medicine, prescriptions, glasses or anything you need for everyday life
- Clothes for 3 days, including warm clothes and strong boots or shoes
- Personal items, such as toothbrush, toothpaste, period products, contraception
- Blankets or something else to keep you warm. If you have them, a sleeping bag and inflatable mattress
- Any special food or eating things you need, for example, baby food, special drinking cups
- Your animals, their food and anything else they need
- Important documents such as your healthcare card, passport and insurance papers
- Your emergency plan and important contact details
- Mobile phone and charger, laptop or tablet, external hard drive, spare batteries
- Important photos and personal treasures
- Spare home and car keys, some cash if you can
- Any extra items you need
